PROTECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

This privacy statement provides information about the processing and the protection of your personal data.

Processing operation: *De-risking Energy Efficiency Platform (DEEP)*

Data Controller: *Directorate-General for Energy – Directorate B: Just Transition, Consumers, Energy Security, Efficiency and Innovation – Head of Unit B2 Energy Efficiency: Policy and Financing*

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1. Introduction

The European Commission (hereafter ‘the Commission’) is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#) of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to processing operation De-risking Energy Efficiency Platform (*DEEP*) undertaken by the Data Controller is presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

The De-risking Energy Efficiency Platform (*DEEP*) is a database containing technical and financial performance data of energy efficiency projects. By supporting *DEEP*, the EC aims to contribute to boosting investments in energy efficiency in the EU.

The database administrator collects contact details of data provider in order to be able to make contact with that person (if necessary) to verify the correctness and completeness of the project data before uploading it into the database. The data provider submits the project data to the database administrator by email (in a given template in the form of excel sheet provided by database administrator). Your data will not be used for an automated decision-making, including profiling.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data

We process your personal data, because (art 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725): processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the EU institution.

The legal basis of the processing has been laid down in Directive (EU) 2023/1791 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 13 September 2023 on energy efficiency and amending Regulation (EU) 2023/955 (recast) in the Article 30.8(c).

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

In order to carry out this processing operation, the Data Controller obtains your personal data:

- Your name
- Your surname
- Your email address
- Your telephone number
- Name of your organisation
- Type of your organisation (e.g. beneficiary of EU co-funded project, Public Bank, Private Bank, IFI, ESCO, Scheme Manager, Supplier, Host Investor, Other)

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only processes and keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of the DEEP database, namely 4 years, until 2028.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to the [Commission Decision \(EU, Euratom\) 2017/46](#) of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your data on behalf of the Commission, and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the transposition of the General Data Protection Regulation in the EU Member States ('GDPR' [Regulation \(EU\) 2016/679](#)).

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures in place. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff and to the staff of our contractor responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to authorised staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, rectify or erase your personal data and the right to restrict the processing of your personal data. Where applicable, you also have the right to object to the processing or the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the Data Controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.
